

PARMACHEENE ROAD

It has come to the attention of the Lake Helen Police Service that individuals have been using the Parmacheene Rd as their own racetrack.

Vehicle tracks have been observed the entire length of the road practicing one's drifting skills. This driver fails to recognize the safety for other users of this road as tracks are observed drifting around blind corners, using both sides of the road. This driver had come to rest in the ditch on more than one occasion.

This road is used daily by homeowners and cottagers and Band members out for a leisurely drive. It is also used for our younger members as a sliding hill. Let us not sit idly by and wait for another tragedy to occur.


The focus of this session will be the **Lakehead Forest Management Unit**, however values located on other forest management units can also be recorded.
