- A swim test, of one length of the pool, is required for all kids interested in swimming in the deep end.
- Children under the age of 6 may not be admitted into the pool unless they are accompanied by a parent or guardian who are responsible for direct supervision.
 Maximum of two people/parent.
- There must be one supervising caregiver for every 4 non-swimmers aged 6 to 9
- No parents on deck during swimming lessons!

Family Support and Cultural Coordinator - Full Time

The Family Support and Cultural Coordinator (FSCC) is responsible for the coordination and implementation of parental/caregiver support services and Aboriginal culture and Language teachings from Thunder Bay Aboriginal Head Start. The FSCC will plan, prepare and deliver culturally relevant programming and language lessons to children and their caregivers, offer resources and referrals to encourage empowerment and provide culturally appropriate teachings.

Transportation Driver - Casual/On-call

The Transportation Driver is responsible for ensuring the health, safety and welfare of the children, parents and staff during transportation to and from the center and on all outings. All applicants must possess a Class "F" driver's license, or equivalent and have the ability to work flexible and on-call hours, which typically remain during the daytime hours of 7:45 am – 4:30 pm.

Cook - Casual/On-call

The Cook is responsible for the daily operation of the kitchen and provision of healthy and nutritional food services for children (ages 18 months to 6 years old) at Thunder Bay Aboriginal Head Start. The cook will prepare well-balanced, homemade snacks and meals that adhere to Canada's Food Guide and to traditional Aboriginal food customs and practices. Applicants must have the ability to work flexible and on-call hours.

Early Childhood Educator - Casual/Supply

The Registered Early Childhood Educator is responsible for Aboriginal children (ages 18 months to 6 years old) attending Thunder Bay Aboriginal Head Start. Utilizing best practices and "How Does Learning Happen?" criteria, the RECE will contribute to the healthy mental, spiritual, physical and emotional development of the child to allow for an easier transition to the next level of education.

EAGLES NEST 2018 YOUTH CAMP

JOINING INSTRUCTIONS – CANADIAN ARMED FORCES <u>EAGLES NEST 2018 YOUTH</u> <u>CAMP</u>

<u>GENERAL</u>

1. The Canadian Armed Forces EAGLES NEST 2018 Youth Camp is designed to provide young people who are selected by their communities with exposure to the Canadian Army style military skills training. This is used as a vehicle to develop their inherent leadership skills and build self-confidence. EAGLES NEST 2018 will be conducted over seven (7) training days, during the period 5-11 August 2018, for 30 members of Fort Willian First Nation. While this camp will challenge the students physically and mentally, it will be conducted in a wholly positive atmosphere.

OUTLINE OF TRAINING

- 2. Students will receive training in the following areas:
 - a. Leadership and team building in small groups;
 - b. Physical fitness training
 - c. Navigation with map and compass;
 - d. Field craft to include lessons and practical application of judging distance, patrolling, and camouflage and concealment;
 - e. Basic weapons handling;
 - f. First aid; and
 - g. Watermanship with military assault boats.

PREREQUISITES

- 3. Personnel must meet the following requirements to attend this course:
 - a. Be selected by their communities; and
 - b. Be physically fit to a level that will allow them to walk through forested areas for an extended time, paddling a boat, swimming, be active and live in austere conditions for the duration of the camp.

REPORTING

4. The students will report to the FWFN Community Hall Parking Lot, 400 Anemki Dr, Fort William First Nation, ON P7J 1J4 at 1000 hrs on 05 August 2018. The candidates must have

appropriate clothing to be comfortable in the outdoors. Waivers that require parental signatures need to be completed prior to arrival at the Camp.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

5. All students are required to have their own hiking boots, running shoes, swimwear, underwear and personal hygiene kit for the duration of the course. All other clothing and equipment, including sleeping bags, will be issued to them for the duration of the camp by the camp staff. A list of personal items is enclosed in this package.

RESTRICTED EQUIPMENT

6. Students are not to bring knives, pioneer tools (ax, machete, hatchet) or any other weapons to the camp. Other prohibited items include narcotics, alcohol or any item prohibited by Canadian law. Students should minimize the amount of valuables that they bring with them as accommodation will be tentage and there will not be anywhere to secure them.

PRE-COURSE TRAINING / PREPARATIONS

7. Course Staff: All course staff will be selected for their ability to interact positively with young people and to ensure there is a mix of gender and cultural diversity. All camp staff will receive a two-day CAF Aboriginal Awareness Training package prior to the camp commencing.

8. Candidates: There are no periods off during the camp; all students will remain as members of the camp twenty-four hours per day for the duration of the camp. As such, personal administration, banking and other affairs of an individual nature must be completed prior to commencement of the camp.

RATIONS / FEEDING

9. The ration plan will be dependent on each days training and will be a combination of fresh and hard rations. DAILY ROUTINE

10. The daily camp routine will run from 0600 hours to 2100 hours (6:00 AM to 9:00 PM).

CULTURAL CONSIDERATIONS

11. There will be two counsellors present 24 hours per day for the duration of the camp. Cultural awareness training will also be included daily, not only for the Camp participants, but as well for the military Camp and Training staffs.

<u>SAFETY</u>

12. Safety is paramount throughout the conduct of the camp. All risks will be mitigated through the instruction by highly qualified staff. All training will be conducted in accordance with applicable Military Training Safety regulations and procedures.

13. Questions can be addressed to the course point of contact [provide military and community POCs].

GRADUATION

14. We will mark the end of the training with a graduation ceremony and lunch on 11 August 2018, commencing at 1100 hours (11:00 AM). Your family and friends are encouraged to attend if they are able. During the graduation ceremony, all participants will be recognized, as well as the Top Section and the Top Candidate from the camp.
