The Red Rock Indian Band is now accepting applications for the position of Family Support Worker, who under the direction of Chief and Council, will primarily be responsible for creating, managing, and executing a wide range of both Client and Community-Based Services to both the Community and Members of the Red Rock Indian Band at large such as the Aboriginal Diabetes Initiative. This position will also deal with numerous issues that prevent the cohesion of stable family units such as Lateral Violence, Addiction, and Mental Health Issues.

The Family Support Worker must possess the following:

- Ability to manage and facilitate programming considered an asset
- Ability to work after normal business hours
- Must possess strong communication skills
- Experience in the Social Work or Hospitality considered an asset



The Good Food Box



The Good Food Box is a fresh food distribution program that aims to increase access to healthy and affordable food. The program aids in reduction of food insecurity, in order to build healthy communities.

The Good Food Box program provides a box of fresh fruits and vegetables at a lower cost to access fresh food locally.

- Boxes purchased in advance: \$20 a box
- Boxes are ordered and paid for by the second Friday of each month
- Cash only
- Pick up second last Thursday of the month

What are the benefits?

- The box is conveniently available for pick up in your community
- Adds a variety of fresh and nutritious foods to your diet
- Is cost effective

What comes in a good food box?

- Every month, the boxes are filled with an assortment of fresh produce with 9-10 items.

 The contents are based on what is available as well as what produce is in season
 - · Enjoy a new recipe and tips each month that accompanies the news letter

Typical Box:

Carrots, potatoes, onions, garlic, celery, romaine, cucumbers, stoplight peppers, apples, bananas.

Typically you pay \$31.00, or MORE at the store for these items, all your for \$20.00

ONTARIO JURIES NEED FIRST NATIONS REPRESENTATION

Ministry of the Attorney General Asks First Nations People to Fill Out the Juror Questionnaire

Every year, the Ministry of Attorney General sends out juror questionnaires to people across the province. This year's questionnaires are about to be mailed. About one in every 12 people living in Ontario will get one in the mail this summer.

People who fill out a juror questionnaire could be included on a list of potential jurors called a jury roll. This is the first step towards possibly being called for jury duty sometime in the following year.

People who sit on a jury share their wisdom and experience to benefit other jury members and the community. Every courthouse needs jurors for criminal trials, civil trials, and coroner's inquests.

Ontario juries need First Nations representation. The Ministry of the Attorney General is asking all First Nations people who receive a questionnaire to fill it out and return it as soon as possible.

The Problem

There are not enough First Nations people on Ontario's Jury Rolls.

In some places, judges have decided that a trial would not be fair because there were not enough First Nations people on the jury roll. In those cases, the trial or inquest could not go ahead. Everyone involved was denied a peaceful closure.

The Solution

The ministry is asking people who receive a juror questionnaire to complete and return the form as soon as possible so that the jury roll includes your First Nations community. It can also mean that trials and inquests can go forward and there is closure for everyone, including victims and families.

Being selected for jury duty

Not everyone who fills out a questionnaire is selected for jury duty. People who are selected will receive a summons in the mail. If you need to travel to court you can call the courthouse and ask for help booking travel and a hotel. They may even be able to arrange to pay jurors expenses in advance, including meals, hotel and travel.

ONTARIO JURIES NEED FIRST NATIONS REPRESENTATION

It's that time of the year. Juror questionnaires are going out in the mail. If you receive a juror questionnaire, please fill it out. Filling out a questionnaire does not mean you will be chosen for jury service, but it's the first step.

When

Juror questionnaires will be sent out between June and July One in 12 people living in Ontario will get one this summer. Watch for yours.

Why

Your wisdom and experience is valuable. Ontario juries need First Nations representation.


