CONSULTATION ON INDIAN REGISTRATION MEETING

The Red Rock Indian Band will be hosting Consultations on Indian registration, band membership and First Nation citizenship on Saturday, November 24, 2018 at the Victoria Inn in Thunder Bay, ON. There will be a government representative with the registration department there to answer questions.

We will be consulting on the issues that were brought up during the design phase at the beginning of this year.

These issues are:

1. The removal of the 1951 cut-off from the Indian Act.
2. Remaining inequities related to Indian registration and band membership under the Indian Act.
3. First nation exclusive responsibility for determining membership/citizenship (moving beyond the Indian Act.)

Lunch will be served at 12 noon and the meeting is to begin shortly after. This meeting will be live streamed for those members who live too far to attend. Here is the link for the livestream,

You MUST use Chrome or Firefox as your browser, Internet Explorer does not support the livestream. (technology in Internet Explorer is old). A bus will be available for those from the Lake Helen reserve and from Nipigon who want to attend the meeting in Thunder Bay, it will be leaving the reserve at 10 am that morning.

A meeting is to be held on Monday, November 26, 2018 at the Lake Helen reserve resource centre at 6 pm. The Minister's special representative will be there to listen to input from the people as well as a representative from the registration department to answer questions.

The details for the livestream and the dates and times for the 2 meetings will also be available on the Red Rock Indian Band website and the Red Rock Indian Band Facebook page. I look forward to seeing you at the meeting(s).

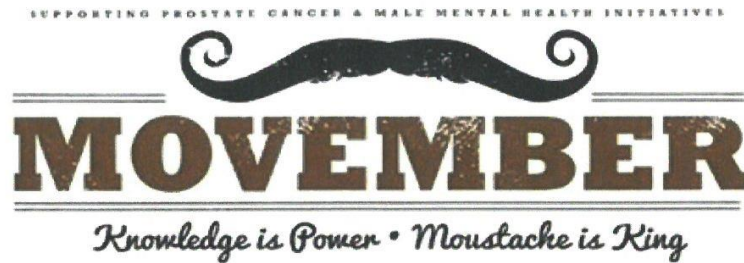

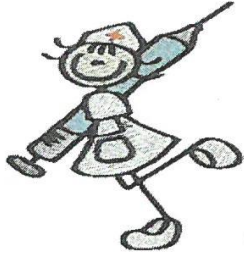

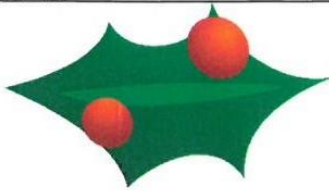

The Red Rock Indian Band is now accepting applications for the position of Family Support Worker, who under the direction of Chief and Council, will primarily be responsible for creating, managing, and executing a wide range of both Client and Community-Based Services to both the Community and Members of the Red Rock Indian Band at large such as the Aboriginal Diabetes Initiative. This position will also deal with numerous issues that prevent the cohesion of stable family units such as Lateral Violence, Addiction, and Mental Health Issues.

The Family Support Worker must possess the following:

- Ability to manage and facilitate programming considered an asset.
- Ability to work after normal business hours.
- Must possess strong communication skills.
- Must Possess College Diploma in Native Child or Social Work.
- Relevant Experience in a related field may substitute for education.
