What is the NIHB Traditional Healing Services Program?

Funding is provided by the Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) for the Traditional Healer Program as part the transitioning of the Non-Insured Health Benefits (NIHB).

Objectives of the program include:

- Provide access to services to NIHB eligible clients for their mental health counselling needs by providers using traditional approaches
- Ensure client safe access to such services by determining providers capacity and eligibility to provide such services (recognized and accepted by the community or communities served)
- To provide access to mental health counselling/healing needs by healers/elders using traditional approaches
- Traditional approaches can include dialogue, prayer, ceremonies, traditional teachings, medicine picking and more
- All NIHB eligible members living on and off reserve can access these services (from any band)
- Traditional healing services are available for individuals, families and groups of community members
- Anyone receiving these services will require to provide the information for NIHB's record keeping requirements: full name, DOB, address including postal code, identification # (status)
- All information will be kept confidential
- Will be provided an opportunity to provide feedback on services received

When visiting an elder/healer it is encouraged to offer a small packaging of tobacco (will have some available at a group event and/or band office)

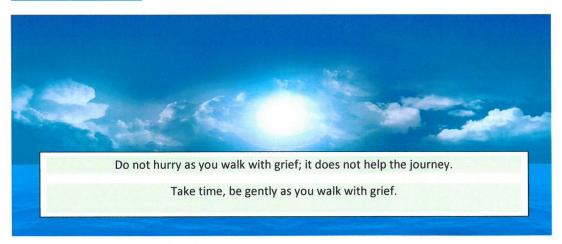

The Red Rock Indian Band is now accepting applications for the position of Family Support Worker, who under the direction of Chief and Council, will primarily be responsible for creating, managing, and executing a wide range of both Client and Community-Based Services to both the Community and Members of the Red Rock Indian Band at large such as the Aboriginal Diabetes Initiative. This position will also deal with numerous issues that prevent the cohesion of stable family units such as Lateral Violence, Addiction, and Mental Health Issues.

The Family Support Worker must possess the following:

- Ability to manage and facilitate programming considered an asset.
- Ability to work after normal business hours.
- Must possess strong communication skills
- Must Possess College Diploma in Native Child or Social Work
- Relevant Experience in a related field may substitute for education.
