The Red Rock Indian Band is seeking a highly motivated individual to fill the position of Director of Lands and Resources. Reporting to the Chief and Council, the Director, Lands and Resources ensures that any government or business venture operating within the Red Rock Indian Band Traditional Area meets their duty consult. The Director of Lands and Resources will be responsible for the overall protection, management and reporting related to the Red Rock Indian Band's natural environment, including the protection of water quality, land resources, fisheries and wildlife habitat, cultural and heritage resources relevant legislation, regulations, directives, policies and procedures.

Job Duties

- Manage the preparation, negotiation, interpretation and implementation of agreements and contracts as they relate to the Red Rock Indian Band, Government, and other First Nations and Trans-boundary agreements
- Liaising between the People of the Red Rock Indian Band, Chief and Council, Government, and Industry on Lands and Resources Related Matters.
- Facilitating the permitting process while leading consultations & overseeing all issues as they relate to Land, Resources and Environment
- Oversee and assist with environmental audits ensuring they are continuously completed in order to minimize undesirable environmental effects of new or expanded operations within the Red Rock Indian Band's Traditional Territory.
- Planning, measuring, reviewing, implementing, and managing all Land, Resources and Environmental activities
- Ensure employees have clear goals and are aware of expectations
- Coordinate activities by scheduling work assignments, setting priorities, and delegating work accordingly
- Ensure that safe work practices are being followed
- Ensure that employees adhere to all health and safety regulations
- Provide leadership for employee relations through effective communications, coaching, training, and development
- Analyse departmental operations and identify areas requiring improvement
- Plan the department's workload and flow
- Evaluate employee performance and provide feedback, coaching, and formal evaluations

Have your ID ready to vote

Three options to prove your identity and address

Option 1



Show one of these pieces of ID

- your driver's licence
- any other card issued by a Canadian government (federal, provincial/territorial or local) with your photo, name and current address

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If you don't have ID

You can still vote if you declare your identity and address in writing and have someone who knows you and who is assigned to your polling station vouch for you.

The voucher must be able to prove their identity and address. A person can vouch for only one person (except in long-term care institutions).



Show two pieces of ID

Both must have your name and at least one must have your current address



Although *Cronobacter* is not commonly linked to human illness, in rare cases it can cause serious or fatal infections. *Cronobacter* can cause rare bloodstream and central nervous system infections and has been associated with severe intestinal infection (necrotizing

enterocolitis) and blood poisoning (sepsis), especially in newborns.
