He tours regularly as a performer and speaker and also serves as a juror on arts and culture organizations across Canada. **OIL TANKS/PROPANE TANKS** – Don't let your tanks get low, this will avoid emergency's in the middle of the night

**FURNACE FILTERS** – Replace filters annually.

# Living with Cancer Support Group






