

We are excited to announce that Blue Box recycling will be coming to RRIB early in the new year - 2020.

Residents will have access to curbside recycling collection provided every other week. The program will require you to sort your recycling into a paper stream and a container stream, but don't worry you will receive lots of information and equipment to help you learn how to sort your recyclables properly.

At the time of the recycling program launch, each residential home will receive two containers to store their recyclables and information about when to place your containers to the curb for collection and what can and cannot be recycled.






