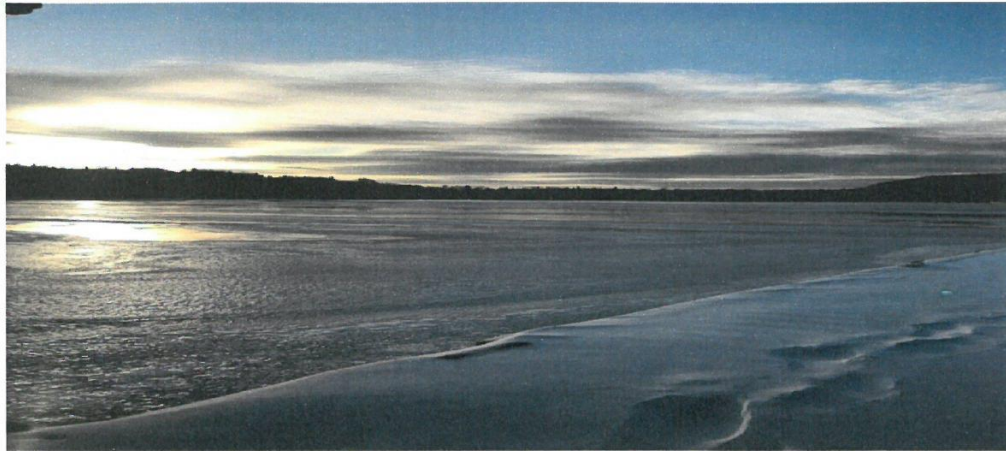

It might not feel like it now with temperatures hovering around -20 C. **SPRING IS ON ITS WAY!**

Spring is an exciting time, no more winter jackets, longer days. Hibernating is not the best option anymore. With all these positive things there is also the negative. Like the spring flooding, septic pumping, driveways full of mud.

At least once a week I hear personal stories of spring flooding. Next year I hope to hear the personal stories of how people avoided the spring flood from affecting their home. Here are some ways to help prevent water from messing up your day. Feel free to add to this list or share ideas with your neighbors. Any amount of water accumulated brings its own set of new problems if it is not cleaned up.

1. Eavestrough downspouts allowing water to free flow away from home
2. If you notice standing water pooling up, dig a little trench so this water doesn't end up in your basement or crawl space.
3. Keep ditches free of clutter, if you see a ditch that is not free flowing pass the message on, this way we can fix the problem.
4. Check your sump pumps,

In some cases, no matter how much we try to prevent these disasters from happening they still do. With a little preventive maintenance, we can lower the number of issues and maybe even avoid completely. This will alleviate the stress that is brought on from operating a home that is not functioning as it should. Thank you





## **FIRST NATION RATIFICATION OFFICER (CONTRACT POSITION)**

The Red Rock Indian Band is currently accepting applications for a First Nation Ratification Officer and Deputy Ratification Officer, who under the Direction of Chief and Council will be responsible for conducting the voting procedures for the upcoming Anishnabek Nation Governance Agreement. The First Nation Ratification Officers will be responsible for ensuring that the Ratification Vote will be conducted in accordance with the Anishinabek Nation Governance Agreement Ratification Process Protocol. The position will last for the duration of the project and will end on 30 June 2020.

### **Duties:**

1. Plans and organizes the implementation of Red Rock Indian Band Eligible Voter ratification voting on the Ratification Document(s).
2. Implements the ratification rules as set out in the Anishinabek Nation Governance Agreement Ratification Process Protocol, and any associated Guidelines in the Red Rock Indian Band.
3. Plans, organizes and implements the mail out ballot requirements under the Anishinabek Nation Governance Agreement Ratification Process Protocol.
4. Manages, develops and controls official documents, and material.
5. Implements security measures as required for the protection of information, material, staff and the general public at the voting stations.
6. Communicates information to the Eligible Voters, First Nation leadership and Union of Ontario Indians' Ratification Vote Manager.
7. Assisting, promoting and participating in Regional and First Nation Information Sessions in accordance with the Anishinabek Nation Governance Agreement Ratification Process Protocol and the Guidelines and as directed.
8. Taking all reasonable steps necessary to ensure that Eligible Voters have a reasonable opportunity to learn about the Ratification Process, voting opportunities and the substance of the Ratification Document(s).
9. Any other duties which may be required to fulfil the duties of the First Nation Ratification Officer in conducting the Ratification Process.

## **Requirements**

- Be 18 years of age or Over.
- Have knowledge of the Anishinabek Nation Governance Agreement initiative.
- be available to work irregular and extended hours as required for the duration of the Ratification Process.
- Have organizational, problem solving and time management skills.
- Be able to follow detailed instructions.
- Be able to travel to Sault St. Marie for training March 11/12.
- Be able to work in a team environment.
- Have excellent oral and interpersonal communication skills and be aware of accessibility and accommodation issues.
- Have computer skills, be able to navigate the Internet, use e-mail and word processing software.
- Demonstrate reliability, diplomacy, judgment, and confidentiality.

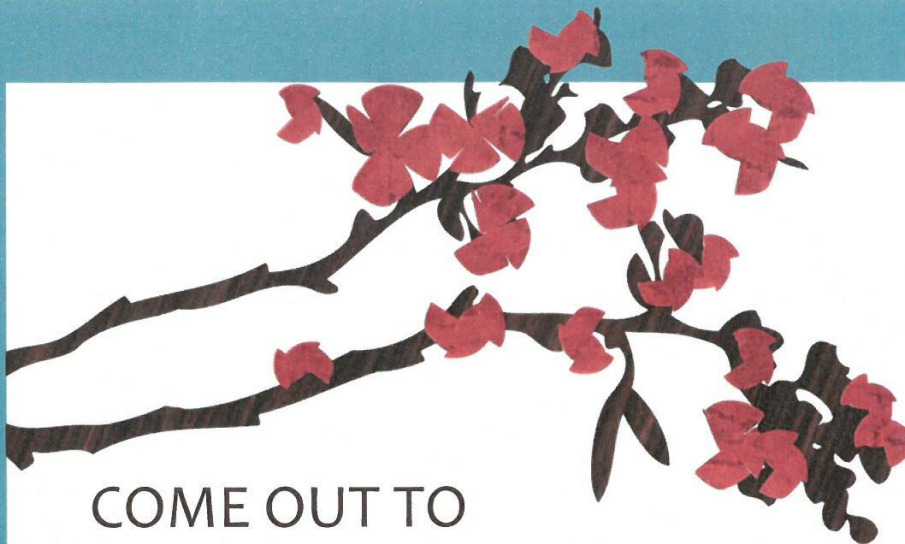

# **Community Volunteer Income Tax Program (CVITP)- FREE Income Tax Preparation**

The CVITP is a collaboration between community organizations and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA).

Community organizations host FREE tax preparation clinics and arrange for volunteers to prepare returns for individuals with a modest income and a simple tax situation. The CRA provides coordinators to guide the organizations as they deliver the program and offers training and tax software for the volunteers.

The CVITP helps people meet their tax obligations and receive any benefits to which they are entitled. Benefits are calculated based on the information a taxpayer provides on their return. Even if the taxpayer has no income to report, they should file a return to continue receiving payments, such as:

- GST/HST credit
- Guaranteed income supplement (GIS)
- Canada Worker's Benefit (CWB) this replaces the Working income tax benefit (WITB)
- Canada child tax benefit (CCTB) (if the taxpayer has a spouse or common-law partner, they also have to file a return every year)
- Provincial or territorial credits and benefits

The CVITP volunteers **cannot** prepare returns for individuals who:

- have self-employment income
- have business or rental income and expenses
- have capital gains or losses
- have employment expenses
- file for bankruptcy
- are deceased in the year

The Red Rock Indian Band will be hosting a CVITP clinic **beginning February 24, 2020.**
